The Principal, J.K.College, Purulia, applied to the Inspector of Colleges of the Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University vide Email dated 03.03.2016 and subsequent letter JKC/133 dated 12.09.2016 for conducting an Academic Audit in the College. Accordingly by the order of the Honourable Vice Chancellor, the Academic Audit Team of the Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University, Purulia has conducted the Academic Audit in the college on *14<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2017*. The said audit is based on the data and information supplied by the college authority for the period from 2014 to the date of audit. **Observations and Remarks:**

Among the B.A. (Hons.) subjects the success rate is satisfactory in Bengali (II), English(II) and Education (II) registering success rate more than 80%. Among B.Sc. (II) subjects the success rate is satisfactory in Geology (II), Mathematicss (II) and Physics (II) registering success rate more than 85%. In the cases of History (II), Philosophy (II), Hindi (II), Botany (II), Chemistry (II), Computer Science (II) and B.Com (II) success rate is found to be moderate i.e. more than 60%. Results for the other subjects are not satisfactory.

Among B.Sc (H) subjects the success rate is satisfactory in Botany (H), Chemistry (H), Geology (H), Mathematics (H) and Physics (H) showing success rate more than 80%. In the cases of English (H), Political Science (H), Hindi (H), Zoology (H), Computer Science (H), Microbiology (H) and B.Com (H) success rate is moderate i.e, 60% or above. Results of other subjects are not satisfactory.

(H) subjects the success rate is satisfactory in Chemistry (H), Geology (H) and Mathematics (H) with a success rate of more than 60%. Result of PG Mathematics is satisfactory registering a success rate more than 90%. Results of the remaining subjects are not satisfactory.

**Observations and Remarks:** Average dropout rate works out at 16.71%. Though, overall dropout rate is not too high, for the subjects English, Sanskrit, Political Science and Microbiology dropout rate is more than 30% which is alarming. So the College Authority is advised to make an in depth study behind the reasoning of such high dropout rate of the subjects mentioned above. It is praiseworthy that in some



of the Departments like Physics, Geography and Economics the dropout rate is very negligible and in Chemistry, it is zero.

• **Overall Observations and Recommendations:**

The University Audit Team has thoroughly checked and verified the documentary evidences in support of all the activities and things mentioned in this Audit Report. During course of visiting the college the Audit Team has met separately all the major stakeholders. Physical verifications have been conducted in respect of all items that were placed by the college authority before the Audit Team. The Audit Team has received all required explanations and clarifications from the authority of the college.

The authority of the college extended all sorts of co-operations to conduct the academic audit smoothly. The audit team expresses its hearty thanks to them. The Principal, members of IQAC, teachers and other staff and the students of the college extended their whole-hearted support for conducting this academic audit. On the whole it can be remarked that there are good number of things/ activities/practices to the credit of the college that have direct or indirect impact on the improvement of academic climate as well as standards of the college.

At the same time, some flaws are also observed. In the opinion of the Academic Audit Team, the following are the things/areas of strengths and weaknesses of the college.

• **Things/Areas of Strengths**

- (a) The college is situated in Purulia town, so, it is congenial in terms of geographical location and communication;
- (b) There are very active NCC and NSS units;
- (c) There are Playground, Gymnasium and arrangements for different games and sports;
- (d) There are friendly and cordial relationships among the teachers, students and other staff of the college;
- (e) There are plenty of endeavours of the management of the college to put for up-liftment of academic environment and standards.

• **Things/Areas of Weaknesses**

- (a) More emphasis should be given in respect of maintaining cleanliness of the campus.
- (b) There is a lack of adequate fulltime non-teaching staffs.
- (c) In Science Hons. Subjects there are wide spread disparities in respect of intake for admission, number of students admitted and number of students appeared in the final examination.
- (d) Results of the B.A (Gen), B.Sc (Gen) and B.Com (Gen) are not satisfactory.
