15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

As an affiliated college under a university which prescribes a definite syllabus and course structure, our college does not have much of a scope of adopting Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary approach. However, in subjects like PG in Mathematics, there is a scope of opting for Business English and Grammar. The faculty members of the Department of English teach this course to Mathematics PG students. Similarly, the faculty members of the Department of Political Science take classes for the Add-on course on Indian Constitution for PG students of English as well as History. Add-on course on Basics of Computer as well as Nursing and Paramedical Training Course are by nature multidisciplinary. This is the domain of multidisciplinary approach of our college. However, we successfully designed, introduced and completed add-on courses on "Better-Your-English" as well as "Computational Sciences" in which the faculty members of the Department of English and Chemistry undertook interdisciplinary approach. Students from different streams covering humanities, science as well as commerce were benefited by these two courses.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As an affiliated college under the university system, our college is not the custodian of the final academic records of the students. However, we have initiated the process by registering our students in the Academic Bank of Credits portal. The respective DigiLocker accounts of all the students have been activated. Our University has also taken steps towards this end. We are expecting to finish this registration by the end of the next semester. We have also started making our students aware of the large implication and benefits of the Academic Bank of Credit System proposed by the NEP.

17.Skill development:

As a part of the CBCS syllabus, all 19 honours departments of our college are running Skill Enhancement Courses. For illustration, English honours students are learning English language teaching as well as Introduction to the Essentials of Business Communication. These two courses are meant to help the learners understand better structures of language, materials of language teaching, assessing language skills and using technology in language teaching. They also learn writing a project report, business negotiations, Summarizing annual report of companies, writing minutes of meetings, Ecorrespondence, and so on. The Chemistry honours students are offered as skill development courses Analysis of soil, water, food products and cosmetics. Under the course of Analytical Clinical Biochemistry, they learn Biochemistry of disease, diagnostic approach by blood/ urine analysis, Determination of cholesterol etc. Similarly, students opting for Sanskrit honours are offered courses on Indian System of Debate and Tradition and History of Indian Dramaturgy. The first course aims to acquaint the learners with the Indian principles of debate and its applications, not just in philosophical dialogue, but in every walk of knowledge. The second course aims to identify the beauty of drama and to introduce classical aspects of development of Indian theatre. Beyond the scope of the CBCS syllabus, the college also arranges skill development by way of various Add-on courses like Nursing training, communicative English, Basics of computer applications, and computational sciences.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college has always integrated in its regular activities dissemination of Indian Classical Knowledge with special emphasis on promotion of local tribal dance, Tusu song, folk culture and language (by way of the annual birthday celebration of Santhal Guru Gomkey Pandit Raghunath Murmu), spirituality, yoga and meditation. The MOU with Ramakrishna Mission and close bonding with Vipasana Centre, Kolkata have always helped us in this regard. Besides, in the UG/PG syllabus of various courses taught in the college Indian Classical Knowledge is well integrated. English honours students study Kalidasa: Abhijnana Shakuntalam, Vyasa: The Mahabharata, Sudraka: Mrcchakatika and Ilango Adigal: The Book of Banci, in Cilappatikaram. Philosophy students go through the origin and development of Indian philosophy, Carvaka, Buddhism, Jainism, Indian Ethics, Indian Logic and Epistemology. The students who opted Honours/ PG in History are offered Environment and Ecology in Indian Ethos and Philosophy, Indigeneous knowledge systems, nature and

societies, History of Science, Technology, Medicine in India, Classical Indian Political thought, Cultural transition in Ancient India: Cultural developments in post-Maurya age and in Gupta era, Indian Art and Architecture. Classical Sanskrit literature like Raghuva??a, Kum?rasambhava, Kir?t?rjun?ya, K?damvar?, Da?akum?racarita, Origin and development of prose and fable (Subandhu, Da??in, B??a, Ambik?datta Vy?sa, Pa?catantra, Hitopade?a, Vet?lapa?cavi??atik?, Si?h?sanadv?tri??ik?, Puru?apar?k??, ?ukasaptati.), Self-Management in the ?r?madbhagavadg?t?, Cognitive and emotive apparatus, Controlling the mind, Self-management through devotion, Basic Principles of Indian Medicine System (Ayurveda), Art of Balanced Living: Self-presentation, Concentration & Concentration are integrated in the Sanskrit Honours syllabus. The Bengali Honours and Hindi Honours syllabi also incorporate different branches of Indian Classical Knowledge.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The quality of an academic institution is judged by the performance of its learners both in final university exams as well as their success in life. Keeping in mind this aspect, we always focus on outcome-based education. For this, results of all semesters are analyzed, a report of the strength and the weakness of the learners is prepared by the departments and necessary remedial steps are adopted. Remedial and tutorial classes are organized, special emphasis is put on mentor-mentee bonding and often individual attention is paid by teachers to motivate and assist students in special need. Free reference books are given, notes are shared, frequent tests are conducted, and assignments are discussed to help the learners improve themselves. Guardians' Meets are arranged to find out if any student requires special attention at home. From time to time workshops, seminars, students' presentations are organized. "Career Counselling and Placement Cell" arranges various programmes to help the students to know various openings of employment, learn soft and life skills and also get placements. Different add-on courses are introduced to enhance student capabilities. Everyday online meditation session is arranged to learn better adaptability, concentration and self-confidence. Thus a holistic approach is adopted for consistently improving outcome based education. The large number of our alumni being placed in very high positions in different fields testify to this.

20.Distance education/online education:

As an affiliated college under SKB University, we do not have the scope to conduct any course purely on Distance/ Online mode. During the COVID-19 induced pandemic all classes were held digitally as per

the Government Guidelines. However, even now some teachers share notes with the students via WhatsApp, or YouTube Channels.

Sometimes, some webinars are also arranged on online mode. The college has its own media centre which is often used in live streaming various programmes conducted in the college premises.

Some teachers record their lectures as well as student presentations. These are uploaded in the YouTube in the public domain. Certain digital Learning Apps are frequently used to make the lessons more interesting, activity based and fun filled. Special Guest lectures are arranged on online mode as and when required. Some of our teachers who have been collaborating with other academic institutions teach in hybrid mode. We also motivate our learners to follow National Online Education Portals like NPTEL, SWAYM, MOOC, INFLIBNET, etc.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation				
1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process				
With utmost care the institution seeks to render curriculum delivery in student-friendly manner. For this, annual academic calendar, central academic routine and arrangements for tutorial/remedial classes etc. were done after regular assessment of the learners. The

timely completion of modularized syllabi and assignments were ensured by sharing inputs and holding regular departmental meetings and "Meet the IQAC" programmes. Structured feedbacks were collected from students, parents, faculties and alumni. They were duly analyzed and remedial action undertaken methodically spearheaded by the IQAC. Mentors were assigned to the students for academic, emotional and financial support. Internal exams, peer teaching, seminars, field projects, quizzes, workshops were conducted departmentally for students' progression. Under the CBCS framework the college provides flexibility in choosing generic elective subjects that would integrate knowledge from different disciplines. The students were made aware of the CO, PO and PSO at the very beginning of every semester, while ensuring their accessibility to eresources and library facilities. The institution introduced student friendly add on courses, invites guest teachers from reputed institutions, and arranges for regular career offline and online counselling, soft skill developing sessions, and campus placement activities as well. Regular yoga and meditations were conducted for physio-mental and spiritual development.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The academic calendar of the college was prepared at the commencement of the academic year 2021-22 keeping in mind the academic schedule of the affiliating University. Commencement schedule of classes for all semesters was mentioned in the academic calendar. The schedules for test for internal evaluations as well as other activities as per CBCS guidelines were categorically notified from time to time in the stipulated time frame of the academic calendar and were strictly followed as far as practicable. Internal tests were conducted by the departments independently. Learners were evaluated on the basis of given projects, assignments, laboratory records, paper presentation, peer teaching, quizzes and percentage of class attendance are also included as part of CIE. Internal tests were conducted department wise. Departments were given freedom about the modus operandi of the internal tests. The percentage of attendance in classes and other activities were also included to

evaluate the internal assessment marks of the learners. Term papers, where necessary, were also prepared and submitted by the P.G. students. Assignments or projects along with the guidelines were discussed with students. Evaluations done by all departments were regularly discussed by teachers helping students to minimize their errors and perform better in future.

Several green practices are adopted through encouragement for the usage of online platforms; use of bicycles; solar- panels; rain harvesting, composting etc. Environmental Day and Earth Day are observed. Seminars, industry visits, excursions, regular activities of Science Club play a significant role to sensitize the students about environmental issues. NSS and NCC units also arrange environmental friendly activities.

As a significant part of existing syllabus, human values are imparted mainly through courses under Humanities Departments. Daily online meditation sessions as well as inspirational video showing are arranged for inculcating desirable value systems. Regular webinars/seminars in collaboration with Ramakrishna Mission, Purulia and other bodies help all to inculcate subtle human values.

The curricula of different departments such as Hindi, Sanskrit, Philosophy, and Political Science contain components or topics on Professional Ethics. The college also advocates fair practice in examination, and NCC helps to spread professional ethics by observing Traffic Awareness Programme, International Yoga Day.

The institution adopts the Comprehensive Internal Assessment System to evaluate the learning levels of the students right after their

admissions. Through various assessment measures the learning levels of the new students are tested and they are classified into "Advanced" and "Slow" learners. The "Advanced" students are put into the Tutorial sessions, while the "Slow" learners into Remedial classes, and utmost care is taken to address the learners' individual problems. "Advanced" learners are encouraged to 1. Make presentations in classes as well as participate in seminars/webinars/workshops and debates, group discussions, interdepartmental/college essay and quiz competitions on various issues 2. provide creative contribution to e-journals etc. 3. write reviews on recommended books 4. join soft skill-developing classes and campus placement interviews.

For the "slow" learners, the focus is on helping them get over their initial fear and hesitancy of the curriculum. 'Slow' learners are encouraged to 1. Attend all classes regularly including remedial sessions, 2. seek the teacher/mentor's help in tackling doubts on any aspect of their study 3. attend special lectures by invited guests thereby boosting their grasp of the subject.

Regular periodic assessments were done to check whether the students thus earmarked were benefitted or not.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methods employed by our students are: 1. Paper presentation and peer

teaching by advanced students 2. Peer review and analysis of assignments 3. Concept-gauging by learners 4. Contribution to ejournals by the students of Science Club and Department of English 5. Health Training course in collaboration with Arambagh C.M. S. Training Centre and many other such institutes for the express purpose of providing students with practical field experience 6. Students interpret the spectral data in the Chemistry Lab sessions as part of the participative learning and problem-solving method 7. Outdoor experiments, field surveys and educational tours are regularly arranged. 8. Students participate in mock parliament competitions, seminars, workshops etc. Various cultural competitions, Seven Day National Integration Programme, Three Day Students' Week Programme, Observation of various special days, like Tagore Jayanti, Birthday of Swami Vivekanandaji and Teachers' Day were arranged to promote experiential, participative learning and problem-solving attitude, 9. Extension/ Outreach activities undertaken mainly by NCC and NSS wings help learners in inculcating leadership qualities and coping up with various challenges.

All these student-centric methods have been transforming the role of students from mere passive receptacles to active participants in the journey of education.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

In the 2021-22 sessions, teachers interacted in mixed mode with the students. Teachers conducted online classes using Zoom / Google Meet / MS Teams as well as WhatsApp. Audio-visual technology, multimedia projectors, digital cameras, and other computing devices were used to explain critical chapters and provide information. Some teachers used private studios with various ICT-enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process and some used smart class rooms from the college. The college also provided high-speed optical fibre for optimizing this facility. Two new add-on courses were introduced in which ICT enabled tools were intensively utilized. Application of various modern computational tools like Gaussian, ChemDraw, Crystal, Origin softwares etc. were taught. In "Better Your English" Add-on course video audio recordings were played to highlight on subtle

nuances in pronunciation. For convenient study of students living in interior areas with poor internet connectivity, the links for all the lectures were uploaded in various platforms. Apart from classroom teaching, teachers were regularly taking online classes also. Webinars, quizzes, paper presentations were also arranged by teachers using ICT enabled tools. Students also used computing devices for problem solving and doubt clearing purposes.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The Teachers' Council prepared the schedule of Internal Assessments (Mid Term Tests, Final Tests, Internal Examinations) mentioning specific dates of paper-setting, dates of examinations and publication of the results. All tentative dates of Mid-Term Tests and End-of-Semester/Session Tests and the methodology to be adopted for the evaluation were duly communicated to the students. Instructions for laboratory experiments were accordingly provided. To address the changing landscape of education with the students at its centre, the internal assessments included paper presentations, home assignments, field surveys, project works, quizzes, surprise

Internal Assessments were also conducted through the more traditional written tests. Debates, power-point presentations, seminars and webinars were also conducted with the aim being to test also the students'/learners' presentation and communicative skills. Performance in the assessment and class-attendance of students were discussed with guardians to update them and have their feedbacks. Threadbare discussions in the class about the assignments given render the process of internal assessment transparent to the students. Furthermore, programmes like "Meet the IQAC" conducted annually, address the grievances (if any) of the students regarding their internal assessment and evaluation. Thus, the institution has maintained a transparent and versatile assessment system.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The grievance redressal mechanism of the institution regarding internal assessment and evaluation has always been transparent, time bound and sensitive. For instance, duly evaluated answer scripts are shown to and discussed with the students within a fortnight of the test conducted. Paper presentations were marked by three teachers and an average was taken with teachers discussing the merits and short comings of students. Still, if a student is not satisfied with the marks obtained, the respective department promptly arranges a meeting with all faculty members and the aggrieved student and comes to a healthy resolution of the issue. In the college website also grievances may be submitted. Furthermore, the IQAC of the institution arranges students' satisfaction surveys annually in which they are asked whether they are happy or otherwise about the methodology adopted for internal assessment and evaluation thereof. The IQAC also arranges an annual programme entitled "Meet the IQAC" with the Principal, members of the IQAC and members of the Teachers' Council present where any grievance of students with regard to internal examination, assessment and evaluation is addressed and a resolution devised. Thus the institution maintains a transparent and robust redressal system for any grievances related to internal examination.

3.2 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.2.1 - Institution has created an ecosystem for innovations and has initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

Within inherent constraints of an affiliated U.G. College, our institution has taken initiatives to create an appropriate environment for generation and transfer of knowledge. The college has established a research cell, whose primary responsibilities include encouraging faculty members to conduct research and produce research articles, advising and assisting the faculty with their applications for projects, identifying new research areas, ensuring sustainable use of the research materials, preserving and making research results available, granting access to the college library and other infrastructure to research scholars. Collaborative research with institutions like SNBNCBS, Kolkata was a notable step in this regard. Interdepartmental meetings and presentations were made for analytical study of geochemistry and biodiversity of Ayodhya Hills. The following events are also carried out to regularly encourage students engage in research:

- (1) Maintenance of butterfly garden and pond ecology to support biodiversity,
- (2) Maintenance of medicinal plants for research,
- (3) Creating bio-fertilizer through the isolation and development of bacteria.

Several webinars and faculty lectures were arranged. The college has taken initiatives for the upgradation of the already established Central Instrumentation Facility. Another step performed for easy knowledge transmission is choosing INFLIBNET-NLIST membership and ensuring constant Internet connectivity.

For the currently enrolled 4682 students, the institution has over the years built up adequate facilities for teaching-learning. We have now, Class Room-56, Laboratory-22, Smart cum Virtual Classroom-03, Projectors-27, E-Class Room-02, Computer Software Laboratory-04, Computer Hardware Lab Cum Digital Lab-01, Language Laboratory-01, Reading Room-02, Library Hall-01, Departmental office Cum Staffroom-21, Recording Room-01, Browsing Center-05, Computers: 170, Thin Client System: 42, Servers: 8, Printers: 40, External CD Writers: 5, Routers: 3, Licensed Antivirus software: 54, Switches: 11, Laptops: 16, Projectors: 27, Scanners: 12, CCTV Cameras: 78, Photocopier: 4, Windows 7 O.S. licensed version: 102, Wi-Fi Devices (Access Point): 4, NAS: 1, Two 35 KV green generators. Each U.G. department has one LCD projector connected by LAN, and each of three P.G. departments with two. Each department has departmental LAN connected computers and printers. Halls for General Class have been furnished with microphone. There is also one language lab, one room with recording facilities and seminar halls for seminars, workshops, symposium etc. In short, the facilities created by the institution are almost adequate for facilitating meaningful education to all.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

The institution has Physical Education department which along with Games & Sports Wing constantly monitors the different sports activities. The students are trained under the able guidance of the physical education teacher. The institution offers different sports like football, cricket, volleyball, khokho, kabadi etc. and athletic items like shot put, javelin, high jump, long jump, discus, hand ball (outdoor) and badminton, table tennis, basket ball etc. (indoor). At present, the college has its own big indoor hall of the size 946.63 sq.mt. and a huge playground(17360 sq. mt.) which offers 9 lane 400 metre track and field, and a football ground inside the track. The playground and the indoor sports hall regularly host events like the celebration of Yoga Day as well as the extension activities of the college under NCC/ NSS unit. The students' Common Rooms have facilities of indoor games like carrom, ludo, chess etc. There is a dedicated room for yoga and meditation, and a gymnasium with 16 high quality equipment. We have an Auditorium with in-built sound system used for all cultural activities. Thus, the physical facilities and motivation for games, sports and cultural activities are adequate.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

Upgradation in IT facilities is an ongoing process. In 2011 two IBM X3400 servers were purchased. LAN was set up in the entire College Campus with high frequency wireless connections and switches. Each department was facilitated with LAN, server access and Internet facility. In 2013 Central Computer Lab was set up with one projector, one Wi-Fi Access point and fifty computers; each was connected through LAN. Campus Wi-Fi was started. One Smart Class Room was set up and two Projectors were installed. In 2014, 5 more projectors and IBM System x3100 M5 servers were purchased to set up Cluster Servers for Database System. In 2018 one NAS was attached to College LAN. Modern Web based college management software was uploaded in the college server. In 2019 eighteen more projectors were installed. In 2019 one new seminar hall with ICT facility and one Language LAB for 42 learners were added. The Broadband Data speed has been consistently upgraded from 10 Mbps in 2013, to 20 Mbps in 2018, to 50 Mbps in 2019, and to 70 Mbps in 2020 Up/Down with Raw bandwidth. Separate DB Boxes are installed.

The institution has a well-defined, efficient mechanism to utilize and maintain different physical, academic and support facilities.

Laboratory facilities are made available as per lab-specific schedule. The departmental store rooms are cleaned up periodically. Expired chemicals and bio samples are destroyed with proper care. All college computers are centrally connected to a Server System

with integrated strong antivirus Firewall. The calibration, repairing and maintenance of sophisticated lab equipment are done by experts.

Library maintains an effective time table. Open access is permitted. Weeding out of old titles, schedule of issue/return etc. are resolved by the Library Committee. Books binding are ensured for old and rare books. Regular pest and termite control is undertaken.

Physical Education department ensures effective utilization and maintenance of sports equipment, facilities and sports activities. Gym functions smoothly under expert guidance.

The college has two centralized computer laboratories, one with N-computing facility. The AMC is provided regularly for maintenance of computers, smart class rooms, college website and servers.

Class room, lecture theatres and smart classes are used optimally following a master routine. Science departments use interdisciplinary facilities. All departments are allotted with at least one ICT enabled classroom. The Building Committee looks after the maintenance of infrastructure.

In the absence of the Governing Body, the college is run by the state-appointed Administrator (SDO) and the Principal. However, the day-to-day management is done with the active participation of all stakeholders, mainly, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, and nominated student members in a democratic structure. Various committees are carefully formed ensuring a decentralized administrative system that takes care of the interest of all the stakeholders in the best possible manner. For example, there exists an Admission Committee established by the Teachers' Council (TC). This committee consists of the Principal, the HoDs of the different departments, the Coordinator IQAC, the Bursar, some teachers with technical skills, and the Head Clerk. The institution has always been subject to external audit. The external/statutory audit is carried out by a Government auditor appointed by the DPI (The Director of Public Instructions) under the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. This audit has been done up to F.Y. 2018-19. For the last three financial years (2019-20, 2020-21 & 2021-22) the external audit could not be done as the name of the external auditor is yet to be finalized. However, the accounts of the college Employees' Cooperative Society are always audited externally.

The mechanism for addressing the audit objections is to place the Audit Report at the GB meeting, make a threadbare discussion of the observations and findings, and take feasible steps for compliance.

Apart from General Govt. Audit, the college arranges special Internal Audit of all grants received from whichever source like UGC, RUSA, and DST. Also the college lay emphasis on:- 1. Schemewise audit of grants received from UGC, State, and Central Government, 2. Checking of all construction-related bills by a qualified Govt. engineer, 3. Regular checking of all Bills and vouchers/receipt of funds collected/donated by members for some philanthropic cause, by the Bursar of the college.

INSTITUTIONAL VALUES AND BEST PRACTICES

7.1 - Institutional Values and Social Responsibilities

7.1.1 - Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the year

The college has always been sensitively dealing with issues of gender equity ensuring its promotion as well as taking all possible measures that no biased treatment is meted out to anybody on the basis of gender. For this, the college has formed two different subcommittees: Gender Equity Cell and Cell for prevention of genderbiased treatment or harassment. These two committees regularly meet and conduct different programs and activities spreading awareness among the learners as well as members of the staff in the college. Last year on 8th March 2022 International Women's Day was celebrated

with members of the staff and students and a number of speakers highlighting on the importance of gender equity. The IQAC also took initiative by conducting an online awareness program on "Gender Equity - The Need of Changing Mindset" on 16/06/2022. Two of our students and one faculty member represented Purulia at the state-level workshop on "Gender issues: Domestic violence & its remedies" on 30th May 2022. The main focus of this discussion was on the acceptance of the neuter gender as an important integral constituent of human beings. Different departments also were alert that no discrimination on the basis of gender was done.

Solid waste management:

• Non-biodegradable and biodegradable wastes are collected and dispensed with separately on regular basis.

• Empty acid bottles accumulated every year are disposed of through licensed vendors. The use of paper is minimized.

Liquid waste management:

 Liquid wastes generated by canteen, urinals, washrooms are transported by proper drainage system into the six soak pits dug out in the vicinity of the waste generating areas of the college.

Biomedical waste management

• The pathogenic and non-pathogenic microorganisms discarded from the Bioscience Departments are disposed of after Autoclaving and incineration.

E-waste management:

 Non-working computer spare parts, electronic scrap components etc. are sold to a licensed vendor following the regulatory norms. Members of the staff and students are made aware of ewaste hazards.

Waste recycling system

 Recycled aggregates obtained from construction and demolition waste are reused in different construction activities like spreading pavement blocks.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management

- Liquid chemical wastes generated from different laboratories are filtered, diluted with fresh water, and then collected in the soak pits.
- Liquid waste containing strong acid/ alkali is cautiously dealt with and neutralized before disposing of.
