The College: A Brief Background

The district of Manbhum under Bihar, now the district of Purulia in West Bengal, was lagging behind in every sphere of society, not to talk of education. The first modern school, according to Henry Rickets, was established in Purulia in 1853 in form of an English School. Water flowed down Kangsabati for the decades. India won her freedom in 1947, and Jagannath Kishore College started its journey on 22nd July, 1948 as a private college affiliated to Patna University, thanks to the enterprising efforts of people from all walks of society in Purulia. Jaharlal Basu, Jatin Dutta, Shyam Sundar Sinha Mahapatra, Dhiren Bhattacharya, Jagadish Mukherjee, Ashok Choudhury, Manmath Kuiry and others felt it to be an abiding necessity, as the proficient students from this economically challenged area could hardly afford to pursue higher education going over to Ranchi, Hazaribag, Patna, Bankura or Calcutta. The dream of these enthusiastic people came true when Gokul Kumari Devi, the widow of Sri Jagannath Kishore Lal Singdeo of the Kashipur Raj, donated a fund of One lakh rupees for the foundation of a centre for higher education in Purulia. Shankarlal Singhanian, an eminent businessman of the time, contributed an amount of six-teen thousand rupees. A considerable amount of funds was also raised in form of public donation. The college was named after Late Jagannath Kishore Lal Singdeo, and it started with 109 students admitted to I.A. (Intermediate in Arts) standard with classes being held simultaneously in the rooms provided by Haripada Sahitya Mandir and Union Club, Purulia. Later on the classes were shifted to Purulia Zilla School for a period, and, in the meantime, the college building was started at Ketika, Purulia at a land donated partly by Sri Nilkantha Narayan Singha, the provincial Lord of Nowagarh who provided 27 bighas, and partly at the adjacent land of 7.5 bighas donated by Shashadhar Choudhury and his co-sharers.

The college functioned as a private college till it was recognized by the then Government of Bihar as a Govt. aided institution in 1951. The foundation stone for the present Arts Building of the main campus was laid by Sri Krishna Singh, the then Chief Minister of Bihar on 9th September, 1952, and the inauguration of this building was officiated by Sri Anugraha Narayan Singh, the then Finance Minister of Bihar, on 10th October, 1953.

The district of Purulia emerged on 1st November, 1956 after Bengal annexation, and the college came under Calcutta University. J. K. College was affiliated to The University of Burdwan in 1961, and in 1963 the college was taken over as a sponsored college by the Government of West Bengal. No less significant is the fact that J. K. College came under newly established Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University, Purulia from 2010. The campus office of this new University was J. K. College, and the building of the University is built at a site at Ranchi road, on a land of some approximately 40 bighas donated by J. K. College to the authorities of Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University, Purulia for this noble project in the year 2011. This is how J. K. College passed through sunshine and shower for 74 years to be now recognized as the premier institution in higher education not only in Purulia, but one of the best in West Bengal. The college was accredited by NAAC in 2005, 2014 and in 2020.

Location and Campus:

J. K. College is advantageously located in the district town of Purulia with latitude 23°32' N, and longitude 86°37' E. College campus is situated at Ketika which is in Ward No. 9 of Purulia Municipality. With a spacious campus of more than 50 bighas, well fortified, with big classrooms and wide corridors, a huge auditorium, gardens and ponds, hostels and a vast play ground with well-connected cinder path. J. K. College is 1.5 km. from both Purulia Railway Station under South Eastern Railway and Purulia Bus Stand, enjoined with the township through the bypass that connects itself with NH 32.

J. K. College, Purulia boasts of well-equipped Central Library and Laboratories, a recently built Language Lab, three smart class/seminar rooms, and 24 hours water-circulation system and generator facilities for the main campus. With adequate sanitary system, big trees and medical unit, the college makes no compromise with hygienic safe guard. Administrative Building, Teachers' Common Room, Recreation Room, Guest House, Non-teaching Common Room, Students' Common Room for both Boys and Girls, Students' Cheap Store, Canteen, Yoga & Meditation Room, well equipped Gym for both boys and girls, Students' Wellness Centre, J. K. College campus is ideal for a budding mind to develop

naturally. The river Kangsabati (popularly known as Kansai) is not far away, and the distant glimpse of the peaks of Ayodhya hills enhance the effect of the beauty of the campus.

Aims and Objectives:

The logo of Jagannath Kishore College, Purulia, West Bengal is 'Shraddhaban Lavate Gnyanam' (শ্রদ্ধাবান লভতে জ্ঞানম) meaning 'those who are full of respect and humanity can alone achieve true wisdom'. FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE

The total area of 21.28 acre of the College campus totally encircled with boundary wall is fully equipped with several physical and infrastructural facilities. The physical facilities such as modern classrooms, seminar halls, technology enabled learning spaces, well equipped laboratories are easily accessible for the stake-holders of the colleges. Besides specialized facilities such as e-learning, Inflibnet etc. guiding towards modern research are also easily available.

- 1. Curricular facilities:** adequate modern classrooms with projectors, easily accessible technology enabled learning spaces, seminar halls, three E-Classrooms, well equipped modern Library with e-section, well maintained laboratories, Language Lab, two Computer Labs, garden of medicinal plants, Butterfly Garden etc. Password free high speed Wi-Fi facilities are available within College Campus.
- 2. Co-curricular facilities:** playground with eight lane 400 m track & field with an enclave of football ground, space for indoor games, gymnasium, medical facility cells. Moreover, there are three NSS units performing multifarious activities such as social work and community services. The NSS units also undertake half-yearly camps with different service programs such as literacy camps, health workshops, environmental awareness programs, blood donation camps, pulse polio immunization. Additionally the

NCC unit of the college aim at inculcating the values of discipline, courage, conviction and commitment enquired for the unity and integrity of the nation by observing the programs of National days and Foundation day of the college.

3. Residential facilities: Accommodations available in 3 present hostels, namely Chittranjan Mahato Memorial Hostel, Thakkar Bappa Adibasi Hostel and Central Schedule Caste Hostel for boy students. Additionally, a girl's hostel is added this year. Moreover, there are adequate recreation facilities with common-rooms and library facilities in the hostels.

a) Chittaranjan Mahato Memorial Hostel (CRMMH) :

This is a general hostel for boys, the first of its kind since the inception of the college, which started from 1996. The hostel has been constructed from the MP's fund under Local Area Development Scheme. Total number of available seats - 56.

Application form for admission to the hostel must be collected only after admission process is over, and necessary contact in this regard may be made in the college office.

b) Gokul Kumari Devi Girls Hostel (GKDGH) :

The hostel funded by UGC, offers 56 seats for girls students.

Application form for admission to the hostel must be collected only after admission process is over, and necessary contact in this regard may be made in the college office.

c) Thakkar Bappa Adibasi Hostel (TBAH) :

The hostel is run by the Government of West Bengal and attached to the college. It admits students belonging to the Scheduled Tribes only. Total number of available seats - 48

d) Central Schedule Caste Hostel :

The hostel is run by the Government of West Bengal and attached to the college. It admits students belonging to the Scheduled Caste only. Total number of available seats - 84

The hostels are supervised by the members of the college staff.

7. Vivekananda Kendriya Granthagar: The Library facilities : J. K. College possesses an enriched library in the district. Perhaps it is the biggest and richest college library in

the University also. The Central Library, with 400 sq. meter area and Reading Room having 75 seating capacity, house up-to-date books and periodicals on various subjects. Scientific method of classification, searching system and computerized cataloguing are the most important features of our library. The library has to its credit nearly 55000 books, and it remains open from 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM on all the working days. Searching of Reference books, INFLIBNET, assistances in searching databases and immediate reprographic reproduction are the most important specialized services provided by the library.

An e-section is added with facility of free downloading & internet surfing. The Central Library is situated amidst greenery and at a quiet place within the campus. It is ideal for engrossed study and deep meditation in the temple of knowledge and wisdom. Beautification of the frontage of the Library is the dream project at hand.

Our Best Practices

Best Practice 1: Activities to promote Value-based Education and nurture Socio-economic/ Philosophical perception: We are passing through a very tough time. Terrorism, Communalism, Corruption, Unemployment, Political power-centricity, and dehumanised social behaviour have become almost the go of the day. The situation has been aggravated to a great extent because of COVID-19. But our country, which has taught the world from the ancient era to the modern times the importance of moral values, cannot become morally bankrupt on the whole. It still holds high the banner of morality and spiritual ethics.

Our institution could envisage this problem quite some years ago, and in addressing the issue, contemplated to lay special emphasis on activities highlighting value-based education, fusion of traditional and modern knowledge, and newer areas of socio-economic experimentation. In various lectures addressed by eminent speakers, the focus has sometimes been on the philosophical perception of the Universe, sometimes on the importance of social and moral values; sometimes they addressed eco-friendly modes of production, and no less the necessity of humane and ethical social ethos.

This practice calls for both administrative vision and initiative, and several resource corners are used to make this fruitful.

The teachers are in constant touch, as usual, with their peers, teachers, research supervisors, eminent scholars and erudite resource persons in general, and outstanding orators in particular. Scholars from different disciplines, agreeing to address related issues, are invited to do so, and both the staff and the students can learn a lot from them. Moreover, the learned speakers expose the audience to relatively unknown areas of knowledge, and newer avenues to cope successfully with the contemporary civilisation.

Besides, there are four NSS units in the college, each having an adopted village. These units are engaged in rendering social services to the concerned villages to improve their living conditions, and in doing so, the villagers are addressed and made aware of social, moral and environmental issues frequently. Apart from this, in the Annual and the Special camps of the NSS, several such important issues are addressed to the students in general, and the NSS volunteers in particular. Talks on the major social, scientific, philosophical, socio-economic and moral issues are organised by the NSS in such a manner that students in general, along with the NSS volunteers, can participate in such programmes and thus may be benefitted.

The NCC Unit of the college is equally active in promoting awareness in various fields and organizing several programmes like Tree Plantation, Yoga Day, etc.

The college has several MoUs and collaborations with National and local agencies/institutions like the Ramakrishna Mission, Purulia Vivekananda Yuva Pathachakra, Ramkrishna Mahato Government Engineering College, Purulia, Kalyan, District Science Centre, Purulia etc. in collaboration with whom we organize seminars and talks regularly and frequently.

Apart from these, the college often arranges seminars/webinars on value-based education and social/ethical/economic/legal/philosophical issues under the aegis of several departments as well as in-house bodies like the Gender Equity Cell, the Career Counselling Cell, and the Women Empowerment Cell etc.

The uniqueness of the practice is reflected in the attendance of the students and teachers, and the results are both quantitative and qualitative. Under the burden of

examination oriented curricular design, the learners are generally unwilling to go beyond the text books. These Talks and Seminars contribute a lot towards kindling the moral flame of the learners as well as the members of the staff.

Keeping in mind the mental stress inflicted because of COVID-19 special emphasis has been given on meditation and moral boosting practices specially through regular mentoring of the learners. Daily meditation has been started online since 4th February, 2021 during evening hours involving students and members of the staff. These meditation sessions are followed by a prayer for the welfare of all. Workshop on meditation was also arranged. A webinar on “Spirituality in Everyday Life” by a senior monk of the Ramakrishna Order was organized.

The regular mentoring of the learners went a long way in solving different issues including financial, physical as well as mental depression, loneliness and losing focus.

Best Practice 2: FACULTY LECTURE SERIES: The college offers 22 courses spanning three different streams: Science, Humanities and Commerce, and has three postgraduate courses for students. In order to take the advantage of teachers with expertise in their subjects and fields, it was felt that there must be some initiative so that the faculty members belonging to a particular department share their knowledge not just to the students of the same department or merely to their colleagues in the same department, but among all faculty members and also interested students from different departments. This activity termed as “Faculty Lecture Series” has become a regular feature since the last three years. The IQAC has ensured that all, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors or State Aided College Teachers may participate in this initiative. No particular teacher is generally permitted to give presentations again and again: rather in the most democratic fashion, teachers are invited to submit proposals, and then one by one from different departments they are given the opportunity to deliver their lectures. It is always scheduled in after normal class hours so that no class is lost, and no interested listener is left out. Teachers and students from other colleges are also invited to join in this programme, and thus it assumes the status of a regional level webinar/seminar. IQAC considers this for CAS benefit of Assistant Professors. A small token of appreciation is also given to the speaker to encourage his/her work.

“Faculty Lecture Series” facilitates the teacher- participant to select a topic which can arouse interest in listeners from different fields, study, research and prepare on the topic thus chosen, and then present it before a gathering including the college Principal, IQAC Co-Ordinator and college Research Committee members. In the process, ideas which either have been abstract, quasi-abstract or in an unorganized state, attain a presentable shape. Another great take of this practice is that it helps teachers become more explicit, more communicable, and more adept in public communication. These discussions accompanied with PowerPoint presentations are followed by question-answer sessions. Not that only the listeners learn new things, even the knowledge of the teacher-presenter is expanded by the meaningful exchange of ideas. Curiosity for a specific issue is aroused, and a new awareness dawns. This exercise also offers an opportunity to explore the subject more deeply, and may also lead to some important path breaking research. The college has arranged to record the videos of all these deliberations, and thus a rich repertoire of interdisciplinary studies is being created for future learners and research scholars.

In the academic year, 2020-21 the college could organize four such lectures under “Faculty Lecture Series”.
